DARA O'SHEA NAMED CHECKATRADE TROPHY PLAYER OF THE ROUND

DARA O'SHEA PRAISED THE DEFENSIVE PERFORMANCE OF HIS TEAMMATES IN THIS SEASON'S CHECKATRADE TROPHY HAVING PICKED UP THE AWARD FOR THE PLAYER OF THE ROUND.

The accolade, which covers all three of the group games, was presented to Dara for his sterling performances against Yeovil Town, West Ham United under-21s and Bristol Rovers which saw the Grecians keep three clean sheets and qualify for the knockout stages by winning the group.

"It feels great," said Dara, who is on loan to the Grecians from West Bromwich Albion. "It is nice to be recognised for your performances. I think I defended well from the fact that we kept three clean sheets, but I think as a team we defended really well. We showed we could defend when we had to and then we attacked and we scored goals as well." 

Belief in yourself, in your teammates and in your coaching staff, that together you can come through a rough patch.

And after making more than 500 career appearances, 258 of which came at Exeter City, Dean Moxey will understand what it takes to get through a difficult moment.

"We had a great start to the campaign as we got some wins and some points on the board early," explained Dean, referring to a stellar start to the 2018/19 campaign.

"Obviously, of late, we've not picked up the results we wanted so we needed to get back to the drawing board.

"It's about self-belief, really. Believe in what you're told to do and the way we want to play, and we just have to keep going. We know we're a good team, we've proved that at the start of the season. We've got a lot of players that have played at a higher level, so fingers crossed we can get out of this run as soon as possible."

As a player who came through the ranks at City before making his first team debut back in 2003 against Accrington Stanley in a 2-1-win, Dean has seen many youngsters come through to try and make their mark in the first team.

But what does he think of the current crop of young Grecians trying to break into Matt Taylor's side on a regular basis?

He continued: "They're great young lads, of course, they come and train with us. Archie (Collins) has been with us for a while but Deano (Will Dean) has trained with us a few times and is pushing his way into the first team.

"Exeter has always been about trying to bring youth through and try and develop that. Matt has carried on what Tis (Paul Tisdale) was trying to do in giving young lads chances. It's good and it's what this club needs. "Their attitudes are second to none, they come in and enjoy it, you can tell they enjoy it. They're there to impress and they realise that with Matt in charge, and as well as under Tis, they've got a chance at this club, if they do well, they can break into the first team."

Dean has worked under a number of managers during his career. He had two spells working under Paul Tisdale, first when the club won back-to-back promotions, but also on his return last season as City made it to Wembley.

The defender revealed that now working under his former teammate in Matt Taylor, only minor changes have been made to the setup at St James Park, and the City number 21 is enjoying life under a new manager and new coaches.

"There are little things that he's (Matt) made his mark on but there's nothing major. We do some similar sessions but it's Matt's take on it. Whatever Matty puts on for us we try and implement on a Saturday.

"He's good, always talking to you, and

he was like that as a player, he'll talk to you if you need it. He's got Greeno (Dan Green) and Eric (Kinder) as well, so it's good and Wayne Carlisle has been involved in recent weeks too.

"There are familiar faces that I've worked with for a few years, but he's come into his first job and done really well. He was captain towards the end of my time here, so you could tell he was always going to go into that sort of role as a coach or manager. It happened quick over the summer to appoint him after Tis left but he stepped up, he wanted the job, went for the interview and told them that he wanted it and it's a great club to have your first job in management at."

Since arriving back in Devon, Dean has been deployed in a number of different positions for City. Whether that be in his most comfortable left back spot and occasionally in midfield, but he has also filled in as a central defender - a position he has grown to quite enjoy.

He continued: "At first last year, not so much, but I've said it to so many people that I'm just happy to be out here playing and I'll play in any position that I'm put. I had to learn quickly last year up at Notts County and they brought on Shola Ameobi and had Jon Stead up front. It was a hard game, but we came out on top and it was one of those where you never know, with injuries. I stepped in and enjoyed it against Peterborough."

The Grecians are set to go into a big set of Christmas fixtures which sees them go up against Oldham Athletic, Yeovil Town and Grimsby Town before they see the new year in with a trip to Swindon Town. An experienced Dean is well aware of the importance of the Christmas schedule with lots of points up for grabs.

He said: "This is a big stage of the season. We have got a lot of games coming up against teams that we feel we can beat. We feel we need to take a lot of points out of this month to stay


in there, it's going to be big for us to get points over this period, as hard as it will be.

"Less travelling is always good, you never know, as you see with Macclesfield anyone can beat anyone in this league. We'll have to be on our best game to beat any team that comes to the park.

"It's hard when there are so many games involved but it's one of those where I'm used to it now. I've done it for so many years before so it's second nature really. We'll be in for training on Christmas day for the game on Boxing day.

"I'm used to it, some of the younger lads might not be but it is what it is. Everyone has their own recovery things to do and we'll be in over that time, maybe there will be a little less training over that time because the games and then the recovery sessions, but it's one of those when the games come you prefer to play the games than train, so you don't really mind."

A busy schedule over the next month or so could well have a bearing on



how the Grecians finish the 2018/19 campaign. As always, there are sure to be more twists and turns between now and May, but with experienced pros such as Dean in the squad, no doubt City will be pushing as hard as they can to be back up there come the end of the season.

BOUNDARY PARK (OL1 2PA)

Boundary Park has a capacity of 13,513. The stadium takes its name from the fact that it lies northwestern extremity of Oldham, with the boundaries of Royton and Chadderton lying immediately to the north and west of the ground. Exeter City fans will be in the Chadderton Road end of the ground.

GRECIAN TRAVEL

Grecian Travel will be departing for Oldham at 7.30am on Saturday, December 22, from outside Unit 1 nightclub. The fare for the trip to Boundary Park is £36.

Other pick up points include: Honiton Road Park & Ride (by Miller and Carter steakhouse), Cullompton Services (junction 28), Tiverton (junction 27), Taunton (junction 25), any other pickups en-route by prior arrangement. RAIL

Getting to Oldham by train, involves first getting to Manchester Piccadilly and then catching a metrolink train out to Boundary Park. The closest metrolink station is Westwood, which is approximately 1.3 miles and a 20-minute walk to the stadium. If you catch the 8.23am train from Exeter St Davids on Saturday, December 22, you can arrive in Westwood for 1.43pm.

PUBS/FOOD

According to the footballgroundguide. com, The closest pub is the Clayton Green, which is a Brewers Fayre outlet and can be found two hundred yards from the corner of the Main Stand. There is also the Greyhound Inn, which is across Broadway down Holden Fold Lane. This pub welcomes visiting fans, shows Sky and BT Sports, offers real ale, serves freshly cooked food and is family friendly. It is also has a large car park which can accommodate coaches. The pub is around a 10-minute walk away from the visitors' turnstiles.

Our campaign is in memory of Exmouth mother and former City supporter Sarah Wright. Sarah desperately needed a double lung transplant in order to live a normal life but sadly no transplant became available despite her being at the top of the national transplant list and Sarah died on November 9, 2012. However, as in life, she thought of others and gave the gift of life by donating her organs, saving three people's lives the afternoon she passed away.

Since Sarah's death, her father and his merry band of helpers have kept Steve's promise and promoted organ donor sign up campaigns.

Since June 2012 a massive 517 separate campaigns have been held resulting in a staggering 5942 new organ donors coming forward and this gives Exmouth the highest sign up rate for any comparably sized town in the UK. Today's campaign is all about getting the message across to City and Crewe supporters and we are confident that both set of supporters will give their support to our endeavours.

EXETER CITY 8 COVENTRY CITY 1

BACK IN THE DAYS BEFORE THE FIRST WORLD WAR, CITY CREATED A SENSATION WITH AN 8-1 WIN OVER A NEW BROMPTON TEAM THAT LATER BECAME GILLINGHAM.

In the years that followed, particularly since joining the Football League in 1920, fans had not experienced an afternoon quite like that one at the park – that was until Coventry City rocked up in December 1926.

In the build up to the match City were very much the favourites, largely thanks to the potential of the forwards, and also because Coventry had struggled to adjust since being moved into the southern section of the third division.

At the time Coventry were commonly known as the peepers, but on this particular afternoon they would not be able to believe their eyes as the Grecians forward line fulfilled their promise by running riot on the visitors beleaguered defence. The opening goal came in the fourth minute, when Dent opened his account for the Grecians by heading the ball past Randle and running round him to strike home from close range. A second came soon after when McDevitt played a perfect through ball into the feet of Blackmore, who hit a fast rising shot into the roof of the net.

As the game approached the 20 minute mark, City were awarded a penalty, but this was spectacularly saved by Newton, who dived full stretch to palm out Charlton's powerful effort.

Despite this save, and his subsequent heroics throughout the match, things did not get any better for the visitors, and in the 29th-minute Compton made it 3-0 by hammering in the ball off the far post.



Coming out in the second half, City could have taken it easy, but they continued to put on a performance that was described in the papers as 'pure unadulterated football'. Showing greater pace and intelligence to a man, and peppering the peepers goal, the score was soon 5-0 as Dent and then Blackmore added to their tallies with precision finishing.

Numbers six and seven came through tidy combinations between the forward lines, and while McDevitt could not get on the score-sheet himself, it was his genius that led to Compton and Purcell bagging easy goals from close range.

With just five minutes left to survive their ordeal, Coventry grabbed a goal of their own as Heathcote headed home from a corner, but their misery was not completed until the very last minute when Purcell snuck in to make it 8-1.

The home crowd was ecstatic, shouting "one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight," reflecting the goals that matched the club's highest ever league win, and the setting of a club record victory in the Football League that remains to this day.

ANY PLAYER WILL TELL YOU THAT PLAYING YOUR BEST FOOTBALL IS ALL ABOUT CONFIDENCE.

No matter how much talent you have, confidence is the difference between producing consistently good performances and finding yourself stuck in a rut.

All players will, at some point in their career, suffer from a crisis of confidence, some more glaringly than others.

Even at the very top level, players can become engulfed by self-doubt. Fernando Torres was a world beater when he starred for Liverpool but was a shadow of his former self when he made the move to Chelsea.

Manchester United star Romelu Lukaku couldn't stop scoring at the start of the season but then went 12 games without a goal as doubt crept in.

And Germany, as a collective, have gone from being top of the world to apparent has beens.

The game is littered with examples of players that have gone from the top of their game to being maligned as washed up.

As fans we are all too quick to make judgements on players. Our assessments go from over the top praise to writing off an individual.

Given that our emotions are entwined in the fortunes of a club, we are sometimes guilty of being too quick to deliver our opinions.

We know the script. A player's game starts to disintegrate and the longer it goes on the more the pressure builds. Supporters quite rightly wonder what is going on and become disgruntled.

Take Exeter City as a case in point. The table will tell you that the Grecians have gone from a side oozing confidence to one suffering from a serious case of self-doubt.

What else can explain the contrast of going five games without defeat at the start of the season to one which has now gone eight games without a win?

Aside from the absences of Hiram Boateng and Troy Brown, the vastly differing results have been delivered by the same group of players.

The classic question in sport is why? Why are Exeter struggling to keep clean sheets? Why have the goals largely dried up for Jayden Stockley? Why is Exeter's defence suddenly plagued by indecisiveness? And why is the midfield lacking a creative spark?

As much as you search for answers, it probably all comes down to confidence. The positive part is that as quickly as confidence can ebb away, it can be rediscovered by one positive result.

Exeter need a win right now, any win will do. A scrappy, ugly victory just to get their season back on track.

As much as Exeter are struggling, this afternoon's visitors, Crewe Alexandra, are hardly brimming with confidence.

Six defeats in their last eight games in all competitions means this afternoon's contest will be a battle of belief. Who will stir from their recent slumber and who will remain stuck in the cycle of desperation?

By shortly after 4.45pm this afternoon we will all know the answer to that.

TONY MORRIS

Tony Morris was born in Heavitree and educated at Ladysmith, Whipton infants, Summerway, Pinhoe Primary and Exeter School. He became a regular Big Banker in 1955. Though exiled since 1963 as a writer for numerous publications (Racing Journalist of the Year in 1990), he is still City-mad. Proud father and grandfather of staunch City fans. Here are his latest thoughts ON football and the Grecians.

IN JANUARY 1960 CITY HAD A THIRD ROUND FA CUP MATCH AGAINST LUTON TOWN, THE PREVIOUS SEASON'S BEATEN FINALISTS.

It was the biggest game in my five seasons following the Grecians, and I was determined to be the first into the ground, so I could claim a place on the halfway line in the cowshed.

At 8.40am I achieved my initial aim; I was first at the St James Road entrance. Around mid-morning there were about eight of us, and we found company in the form of Tony Court, at that time the Express & Echo's football writer.

It was the obvious task for a local evening paper reporter on such a day – interview the fanatic at the head of the queue for the early editions. So, Court asked me a lot of questions, one of which was: "What do you want to do when you leave school?"

Rather cheekily, I replied: "I'd like your job."

Well, it was no lie. My heart was already set on becoming a sports journalist, and it was just a case of whether I wanted to concentrate on football or horseracing. I was passionate about both sports.

The photo of me at the head of the queue and the interview featured briefly in the paper, soon to be overtaken by

the report of the match, which we lost 2-1.

There were a couple of sequels.

The first one came a few years later, by which time I was a sub-editor at the Press Association in London. One of the phones rang in the area which should have been occupied by the guys whose job it was to take down the reports sent in by correspondents.

I was alone. The typists were presumably in the pub downstairs, which was not an unusual event.

So, I took the phone call, learning that the guy on the other end was Tony Court, wanting to deliver his report of the speedway match involving Exeter Falcons that evening.

I was pretty good at taking dictation by

that time, and duly got the job done. While I was sorely tempted to ask whether he remembered interviewing a City fan in St James Road in 1960, I decided against it.

Of course, I never knew whether Tony Court ever had an ambition to get to Fleet Street, and I still don't know how his career unfolded. I just knew that I'd got there before him.

But to emulate Court with a coveted seat in the press box at the Park I had to wait 58 years. It finally happened last month, an indulgence afforded me by media manager Simon Larkins and programme editor Ben Strange.

Thanks for the privilege, chaps. I hope you'll have plenty of positives to report on today's game.



EXETER CITY'S UNDER-18S RETURNED TO WINNING WAYS IN THE YOUTH ALLIANCE SOUTH WEST DIVISION WITH AN EMPHATIC 4-0 VICTORY AWAY AT YEOVIL TOWN ON SATURDAY.

Despite an early scare, it was a quick start from the young Grecians, who scored after just four minutes courtesy of James Dodd.

Just three minutes later, A Trialist doubled the Devon club's lead, before Dodd netted his second of the afternoon on 18 minutes, converting a loose ball following a goalkeeper save. The scoring was completed in 34th minute when Cheick Diabate converted from close range following a set-piece.

Despite facing a high-flying Yeovil side, the away team started brightly, and although the Glovers created the opening opportunity, it didn't faze the Exeter youngsters.

With just two minutes the clock, a misplaced pass from the Grecians allowed the hosts to counter-attack, resulting in Town flashing a shot just past the post.

However, soon after, City created their first chance, which they were to take in decisive fashion.

Defender Jordan Dyer played the ball into the middle, where Dodd and Charlie Lawrence combined. The latter slid the ball back into Dodd's path, and the playmaker fired an effort across the home keeper and into the back of the net to break the deadlock.

The quickfire goal really gave the visitors belief, and just minutes later they doubled their advantage to increase the pressure on their opponents.

Following a Yeovil clearance, City's youngsters were able to tidy the ball up and mount another onslaught onto the Glovers' goal. From the midfield area, Lawrence was able to pick out his striker, and A Trialist

finished well to make it 2-0.

Gribble's men were well in control of proceedings, and their dominance was reflected in the scoreline when on 18 minutes they scored their third of the match.

> After working the ball down the left wing, Lawrence teamed up with A Trialist, before the forward saw a shot saved by the home shot-stopper. Following up, Dodd reacted first to the rebound to stroke the ball home to give his side a three-goal cushion.

> > A dominant first-half display led to the away team scoring

once more before the interval.

Lawrence delivered an inviting corner where Will Dean was unfortunate to see his header kept out by the Town goalkeeper. With the shot- stopper still on the floor, centre-back Diabate smashed in the loose ball to make it 4-0.

In spite of some more neat possession play by Exeter during the final 15 minutes of the first period, the scoreline remained the same when the referee blew for half-time.

As expected, after the restart, the home side came out with a real intent, changing their approach as they searched for a goal to help get them back into the contest.

Yeovil enjoyed a decent spell of pressure at the start of the second half, and they increased the pressure exerted onto the Grecians' penalty box.

The Glovers saw plenty of the ball, particularly in their own half, and with the Devon side happy to sit back and invite their opponents onto them, it meant they were soon back on top of the game again once they got through the home side's bright period.

As the half wore on, further chances fell the way of the visitors. Jordan Dyer squandered a chance from a corner, whilst substitute Theo Simpson struck the post with an effort.

A good defensive structure from City ensured they kept their clean sheet, and with no change to the scoreline as the game drew to a close, it meant the four goals scored here resulted in three well-earned points for Gribble and his players to take back to the Westcountry.



The group of 13 National Citizen Service (NCS) graduates have seen their idea rolled out in Sainsbury's stores nationwide.

The idea was developed after the group spoke to their local food bank during the social action phase of the national youth programme for 16-and 17-year olds.

NCS graduate, Holly Manning, 17, from Exeter, said: "After talking to the manager of our local food bank it was clear that shoppers were being reminded too late about donating, with food bank collection points usually being placed at the exit of the store. We also learnt that people were regularly donating similar items, making it difficult for them to get the quantity and variety that they needed to serve the needs of their beneficiaries."

To combat this, the NCS grads came up with a simple, ingenious idea: pop a branded sticker alongside the items most needed by the local food bank to encourage people to purchase the item and drop it in the existing food bank collection box on their way out.

Holly continued: "Once we had developed an idea, we were confident would help, we set about pitching it to various local retailers. After being turned away by a few we popped into Sainsbury's and spoke to the store manager who, to our delight, agreed to trial the initiative."

WELL WHAT A PALAVER THAT WAS!

What should have been a straightforward match against arguably the least glamorous club in the Football League became anything but when the worst kept secret in football was confirmed just five hours before kick off.

For some reason Macclesfield Town wanted to keep the imminent arrival of former England international Sol Campbell as their new manager under wraps for as long as possible. That was despite the fact that he'd been spotted at Moss Rose at a previous home match and the London-based former defender had apparently been seen in Macclesfield Town centre that morning filming something with Sky TV. That he had flown out of the area was generally known – but to where was a bit more of a mystery with some reports suggesting he was returning to the capital.

However, it quickly became apparent that he was in fact heading to St James Park to have another look at his new charges. All of a sudden Macclesfield were leading the football news agenda and it blew into a massive game of 'Where's Solly'?

Hamish Marshall, working on a different story for Spotlight, saw him at Exeter Airport, then Richard Green saw him in the RGB Lounge at Exeter City, then I clocked him entering the director's box.

As luck would have it I had a TV camera with me as I'd been filming the Exeter Chiefs press conference earlier in the day. Normally, there's nothing better than when the opposing BBC have a big story to cope with – but on this occasion it became so big we were in danger of being roped in ourselves.

In the end it wasn't practical for me to wield the camera and prepare for the game so Brent Pilnick got summoned to come up from Plymouth – you may well have seen his pictures on the BBC Sport website.

Apart from the obligatory hellos, Campbell wasn't speaking. He left that to the official press conference a couple of days later when he certainly couldn't be accused of underselling himself. "You've got an international footballer who has been one of the best footballers in the world coming to your club," he said.

I have to say it's an interesting appointment by the Silkmen who probably have in the back of their mind how another former England international, Paul Ince, also in his first job saved them from almost certain relegation back in 2005 and of course Exeter City have appointed a couple of former England captains as managers in the past in the shape of Gerry Francis and Alan Ball.

Having seen Macclesfield play I think the biggest irony for the former international defender is that they looked pretty solid at the back – the problems I suspect lie further up the field. As we know great players don't necessarily make great managers. It will be interesting to see how Campbell goes.

Despite recording a 6-0 win over Morecambe on the first day of the season, Crewe Alexandra went on to lose eight out of their next 13 competitive fixtures. Since then, David Artell's side have endured a mixed run of results, leaving them in 17th place ahead of today's meeting with the Grecians.

Like City, Crewe also fell to FA Cup first round defeat at home, after Jamie Devitt's stoppage time strike earned Carlisle United a place in the second round. The Alex were then defeated three days later by Shrewsbury Town in the Checkatrade Trophy, before earning three valuable points against high flying Tranmere Rovers at Gresty Road, thanks to a brace from Callum Ainley and a second-half strike from Charlie Kirk.

Crewe's last away outing in the league prior to this afternoon's visit to St James Park didn't end in success, with Crawley Town coming out 3-0 winners against Artell's side.

However, the Railwaymen did manage to record back-to-back home league wins for the first time this season three days later against



Cambridge United, with Ainley and Shaun Miller's efforts securing a 2-0 win.

Crewe failed to make it three home wins on the bounce last weekend however, after going down 2-0 to play-off chasing Oldham Athletic.

A towering centre-back during his playing days, David Artell turned out over 500 times on the pitch in a career spanning 18 years. Artell began his playing days with hometown club Rotherham United and spent five years in Yorkshire, helping the Millers to back-to-back promotions between 1999 and 2001, before heading to Mansfield Town. The 6ft 3in defender spent just the two years with the Stags, before enjoying a further two-year stint with Chester City.

Artell then signed for Morecambe in 2007 and instantly earned hero status with the club after netting a late winner against Preston North End in the League Cup. After three years with the Shrimps, Artell signed for Crewe and spent two years with the Railwaymen. Artell made a total of 82 appearances for the Alex, scoring six times, captaining the club to promotion to League One in 2012 via the play-offs.

After leaving Gresty Road in 2012, Artell spent the remainder of his playing days representing the likes of Northampton Town, along with Welsh

FOOTBALL HISTORIAN LEIGH EDWARDS PROFILES FIVE NOTABLE POST-WAR CREWE ALEXANDRA GOALSCORING PARTNERSHIPS

FRANK LORD AND JOHNNY KING

Centre-forward Frank Lord was leading marksman in Crewe Alexandra's 1962/63 promotion success. Signing professional for Rochdale in October 1953, he moved to Crewe for £3,500 in July 1961 and netted 68 goals in 108 league games while at Gresty Road. He joined Plymouth Argyle for £18,000 in November 1963 and was top scorer in 1963/64, starring as they reached the League Cup semi-final in 1964/65. Sold to Stockport County for £7,000 in February 1966, he had spells with Blackburn and Chesterfield before returning to Plymouth in October 1967. He held many coaching posts and died in Cape Town in June 2005.

Popular inside-left Johnny King was ever-present in Crewe Alexandra's 1962/63 promotion campaign. Born in nearby Wrenbury, he signed professional at Gresty Road in October 1949 and formed a notable left-wing partnership with future England international Frank Blunstone. He joined Stoke City for £8,000 in September 1953 and was leading marksman three times before being sold to Cardiff City for £12,000 in August 1961. Returning to Crewe in June 1962, he featured in the 1965/66 FA Cup run and netted 62 goals in 226 league games overall for the Alex before leaving in May 1967. He still lives locally in retirement.

GARY TALBOT AND ALAN TARBUCK

featured prominently in Crewe Alexandra's 1967/68 promotion triumph. Signing professional for Everton in August 1966, he joined Crewe in June 1967 and netted 18 goals in 85 league games while at Gresty Road before moving to Chester in October 1969. He joined Preston in September 1971, then Shrewsbury Town in March 1973. Helping them to regain Third Division status at the first attempt in 1974/75, he moved to Rochdale in July 1976, then overcame a twice broken leg to play for Bangor City. He then spent over 25 years as a car salesman for a Vauxhall dealership in Wrexham.

DAVE WALLER AND DAVID PLATT

Striker Dave Waller was Crewe Alexandra's leading marksman in four successive seasons. Discovered in Manchester local football, he joined Crewe in January 1982 and made his League debut in that month's 0-0 draw at home to AFC Bournemouth. He grabbed a hat-trick in Crewe's



Centre-forward Gary Talbot was top scorer in Crewe Alexandra's 1967/68 promotion success. He was a photographer with the Daily Mail in Manchester before joining Chester as a part-time professional in September 1963 and twice topped their goal scoring charts. Overcoming injury problems, he moved to Crewe in July 1967 and netted 20 goals in 37 Fourth Division games while at Gresty Road prior to rejoining Chester in June 1968. Leading marksman again in 1968/69, he scored a then club record 83 league goals overall before retiring in May 1969 to concentrate on his photography business in Chester.

Versatile winger Alan Tarbuck



6-1 demolition of Halifax in March 1984 and netted 55 goals in 168 Fourth Division games before being sold to Shrewsbury Town for £25,000 in July 1986. Joining Chesterfield in March 1987, he appeared in the 1989-90 Fourth Division play-off final and later played for several non-League clubs while running a stall on Chesterfield's market.

Attacking midfielder David Platt was capped 62 times by England after leaving Crewe Alexandra. Starting with Chadderton, he had a spell with Manchester United before moving to Gresty Road in January 1985 and was Crewe's leading marksman in 1986/87. He netted 55 goals in 134 league games prior to joining Aston Villa for £200,000 in February 1988 and starred for England in the 1990 World Cup. Later with Bari, Juventus and Sampdoria, he joined Arsenal for £4,750,000 in July 1995 and featured in their 1997/98 double success. He managed Nottingham Forest and England under-21s, then coached at Manchester City.



TONY NAYLOR AND ASHI FY WARD

Diminutive striker Tony Naylor starred as Crewe Alexandra won promotion in 1993/94. He impressed with Droylsden before moving to Gresty Road in March 1990 and starred as Crewe twice reached the play-offs, scoring a club record five goals against Colchester in April 1993. Netting 45 times in 122 league games overall, he joined Port Vale for £150,000 in July 1994 and was top scorer in 1996-97. He featured in Vale's 2001 LDV Vans Trophy final triumph and joined Cheltenham in August 2001. An experienced figure in their 2001/02 promotion success and FA Cup run, he later played for Bath City and Telford United.

Striker Ashley Ward featured prominently as Crewe Alexandra won promotion in 1993/94. Signing professional for Manchester City in August 1989, he joined Leicester City for £80,000 in July 1991 and moved to Gresty Road for a similar fee in December 1992. He appeared for Crewe in the 1992/93 Third Division play-off final, netting 25 goals in 61 league outings before sold to Norwich City for £500,000 in December 1994. Leading marksman in two consecutive seasons, he moved to Derby County for £1,000,000 in March 1996 and later appeared for Barnsley, Blackburn Rovers, Bradford City and Sheffield United.

ROB HULSE AND DEAN ASHTON

Striker Rob Hulse was top scorer in Crewe Alexandra's 2002/03 promotion success. Signing professional at Gresty Road in June 1998, he made his League debut in Crewe's 1-0 win over Norwich nine months later. He helped take Everton to an FA Cup fifth round replay in 2001/02 and played alongside Dean Ashton, netting 46 goals in 116 league games before sold to West Brom for £750,000 in August 2002. Featuring in their 2003/04 promotion campaign, he joined Leeds United in February 2005 and appeared in the 2005/06 Championship play-off final. He then played for

Millwall.

Sheffield United, Derby, QPR, Charlton and

England under-21 striker Dean Ashton was Crewe Alexandra's leading marksman in two consecutive seasons. Graduating from Crewe's Academy, he made his league debut in their 1-0 victory at Gillingham four months before turning professional in February 2001. He formed an exciting partnership with Rob Hulse as Crewe regained First Division status at the first attempt in 2002/03 and netted 60 goals in 158 league outings prior to joining Norwich City for £3,000,000 in January 2005. Sold to West Ham for £7,000,000 in January 2006, the England international played in that season's FA Cup final but injury curtailed his career.

CITY PLAYER BY NUMBER

A LOOK AT THE NUMBERS BEHIND NICKY LAWS' STINT WITH CITY SO FAR...

HAILING FROM A FAMOUS FOOTBALL FAMILY, NICKY LAW CAME UP THROUGH THE RANKS AT SHEFFIELD UNITED, FOR WHOM HE MADE FOUR PREMIER LEAGUE APPEARANCES IN 2006/07.

Following a series of spells at other clubs, he moved north of the border in 2011, enjoying stints with Motherwell and Rangers, winning the Scottish Championship, League One and Challenge Cup whilst with the latter. Having returned to English football with Bradford City in 2016, he signed for the Grecians in July, playing a key role in City's bright start to the season.

4 5 Although he began his career up in Sheffield, Nicky was in fact born locally, during his father's one season stint with Plymouth Argyle. Constituting just a 45-minute trip up the A38, he can therefore consider himself a Devonshire lad.

Handed the number eight shirt on his arrival, Nicky enjoyed a dream start to his Exeter career, putting in a man of the match performance against Carlisle United on the season's opening day. Described as "a class apart" in Matt Taylor's post match interview, it took him just 16 minutes to open his scoring account, neatly finishing off a Jonathan Forte cutback. A menace throughout the day, he also created a number of other chances, playing a major hand in the Grecians' other two goals. His next goal came in mid-September when the Grecians travelled away to Mansfield Town. With City already leading through a Dean Moxey strike, Nicky guided home a header in the 57th minute to double their lead. Although Tyler Walker grabbed one back a few minutes later, City were able to hold on, ending the Stags' unbeaten start to the season.

Prolific during the season's first few weeks, Nicky found the net again just fourteen days later, when the Grecians travelled to Port Vale. Having tapped home a Hiram Boetang cross from close range, it looked as if his contribution would be decisive. However, in scenes of high drama, substitute Idris Kanu scrambled in a 97th minute equaliser to ensure that the spoils would be shared.

> Although he has not found himself on the score sheet since, possessing an astonishing calmness on the ball and the ability to play a pinpoint pass, Nicky has been at the centre of much of what has been good about the Grecians this season. In recognition of this fact, he was voted the Hawksmoor Investment Management Player of the Month for November, winning 23% of the vote in a narrow contest to claim the prize.

Having quickly endeared himself to the fans, the midfielder has claimed three goals and two assists from his 22 outings in red and white this season. A central figure in City's glorious start to the season, his sterling form and invaluable experience will be vital in helping to break them out of the rough patch that they have been enduring of late.

CITY BY NUMBER...13

COMPARED TO MOST OTHER CLUBS, EXETER CITY HAVE TO COVER A LOT MORE MILES ON THE ROAD OVER THE COURSE OF SEASON.

This season loyal City supporters will have to travel a total of 7740.2 miles to watch their beloved City up and down the country. That figure includes the journey home, which is always made sweeter when the Grecians return to Devon with three points. No season had as many wins on the road as 2016/17, as City returned home with three points a record **13** times, the most in League Two that year.

In a season where Exeter started very slowly, losing their opening three games, the first victory of the season came away at Accrington Stanley, as Ryan Harley's long range effort and Jake Taylor's volley gave City a 2-1 win – former Grecian Arron Davies netted for the hosts.

Another win at Colchester followed before City managed to sneak a 2-0 victory at Stevenage despite being down to ten men for the majority of the match, after Jordan Moore-Taylor was shown a straight red in the 24th minute.

While City struggled at home they excelled on the road with emphatic triumphs at Barnet and Morecambe, 4-1 and 3-0 wins respectively. It was actually a defeat on the road that seemed to be the catalyst for the Grecian's turnaround in form that season, as Carlisle scored twice in added time to turn the game on its head and win 3-2.

That defeat was then followed by a 12 match unbeaten run, which included a remarkable streak of seven straight wins. That run contained impressive victories at Cheltenham, Grimsby and eventual League Two winners Portsmouth – all wins which helped catapult the Grecians from the relegation zone to within touching distance of the automatic promotion spots.

A 3-0 loss at Home Park in February ended the good form but Exeter's next win came 17 days later on the road, as goals from academy graduates Ollie Watkins and Moore-Taylor helped City to a 2-1 win over Crawley Town.

City's next away win – a 2-1 triumph at Mansfield – was the 12th of the season, breaking the Grecian's record for the most away victories in a single season.

The final victory on the road that season came at Doncaster, as the Grecians confirmed their play-off place in style with a 3-1 win – goals coming from Moore-Taylor's longrange free-kick, David Wheeler and Liam McAlinden.

It's safe to say there were a lot of happy Grecians driving all over Britain that season.

Cureton's prolific finishing earned him a regular place in Paul Tisdale's frontline, and he repaid the faith with his 40 goals coming in just 77 appearances. His most impressive performances came in the 2010/11 season, where he received the club's Player of the Year award as City rose to their highest ever finish in the Football League. Today the journeyman's his playing career is still going strong at 43, despite Fifa's game engine automatically retiring him at 40!

LEAGUE TWO GREATS CLAYTON DONALDSON

Since the division was retitled League Two at the beginning of the 2004/05 campaign there have been several players who can proudly call themselves a League Two great. From prolific goal scorers to heroic defenders, players have used this league as a springboard to ignite their career as they work their way up from the bottom of the Football League ladder. So, this season, Harry Webster takes a dip into the archives to acknowledge some of the greatest ever players to have played in League Two...

CLAYTON DONALDSON - 2010/11

A striker that our visitors today will know all about, and a player who can certainly be labelled as a League Two great after his goalscoring exploits in the 2010/11 campaign. Clayton Donaldson began his career at Hull City and scored on his first-team debut, netting in The Tigers' 3-1 away defeat at Port Vale in the Football League Trophy. For the next few years Donaldson was sent out on loan to Harrogate Town, Scarborough and Halifax Town before joining York City in the Conference where he quickly put himself on the map, notching a total of 41 goals in 85 appearances. His impressive form caught the eye of Hibernian in the Scottish Premier League, but he spent just one season there when Crewe took interest in the striker after losing Nicky Maynard to Bristol City. Donaldson signed for the Railwaymen in the summer of 2008 but suffered relegation from League One in his first year at Gresty Road, scoring six goals in 37 games. He netted 13 the following year, as Crewe finished 18th. But it was the 2010/11 campaign where he really made a name for himself, finishing as League Two's top goal-scorer as he notched 28 times. To the surprise of many, Donaldson failed to earn a place in the PFA Team of the Year, perhaps due to Crewe finishing 10th. Nevertheless, his prolific form didn't go unnoticed, especially from League One Brentford. The Bees signed Donaldson on a free transfer and he scored 11 goals in his first year at Griffin Park, but the next two years are where he really made an impact, scoring 35 goals in total, as the Bees won promotion to the Championship.

WHAT HAPPENED AFTER?

Donaldson prepared for life in the Championship after slowly climbing up the leagues, but not with the Bees. The forward was signed by Birmingham City and he settled into life well at St. Andrews, finding the net 15 times in the 2014/15 season as the Blues finished in a respectable 10th place, and they finished in the same position in the following

campaign, with Donaldson scoring 11 times. But after Gary Rowett's dismissal in December 2016, he struggled to make the same impact after working under three different managers, including Gianfranco Zola and Harry Redknapp as well as Rowett, as the Blues stayed up on the last day of the season after a 1-0 win against Bristol City at Ashton Gate. Chris Wilder brought him to Bramall Lane the following year as Sheffield United made their return to the Championship, and despite only scoring five goals, Donaldson played his part as Wilder's side made a surprise push for the play-off positions.

WHERE IS HE NOW?

At 34-years of age, Donaldson continues to ply his trade in the Championship, joining Bolton Wanderers on a free transfer last summer after his one-year deal at Bramall Lane came to an end. However, the striker is yet to find the net for the Trotters at the time of writing and has struggled to nail down a place in the starting 11. Phil Parkinson's Bolton side have struggled so far this season, and Donaldson may well find himself in another fight for survival if things don't improve soon.


